Congratulations Class of 2019 seniors: for an excellent job with senior projects this past Fridays. Do not complacent and procrastinate. There is much to do until May 26th. Colleges still keep track on your grades and work on your FAFSA/Scholarships. Do good in the classrooms and in the community. Take care of your obligations (detention hours, withholds, afterschool/online classes) and we see you on the line May 26th.

Every senior planning to attend college, even UH Maui College, should be completing the FAFSA. Colleges use the FAFSA to create your financial aid packages, which doesn't only include Federal grants but, merit/academic scholarships as well.

The most common misconception about the FAFSA is that "I not going qualify, I make too much money." This is completely false. The FAFSA is just an application for Federal Grants, which you may not qualify for if you make "too much money." BUT once the federal government has evaluated if you qualify for their federal grant, they then send the tax information you entered to all the colleges your child listed on their FAFSA form. The colleges use your tax information, student transcripts and SAT/ACT scores to create your child's financial aid package. No FAFSA, no financial aid package, which means no academic scholarships either.

AND our local scholarships require students to complete the FAFSA if they are applying for their scholarship. FAFSA is a must for all college bound seniors!!!

So make an appointment and bring your parents to see Miss Kristy about it. It's better to try rather than regretting it later. For more information, please see Miss Kristy or check our website or official Facebook Page.
