Have you passed all of your English classes (or Hawaiian if you are enrolled in the HLIP)? Are you also "highly proficient" in Arabic, French, German, Hebrew, Hindi, Ilocano, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Mandarin, Russian, Sâmoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Vietnamese **OR** American Sign Language? You will need to demonstrate your fluency in the language other than English (or Hawaiian) by taking an on-line state language assessment during third quarter and earning a score of 5 or higher.
