Did you see the new sculpture on campus? The sculpture is a physical metaphor for the development of students. The transition from the rough hewn surface to the carved surface to the stainless steel fabrication reflect the students transformation from a rough potential to one developed to allow the students to succeed in life. The mooring hole near the bottom is reminiscent of Hawaiian mooring /anchor holes and associates to Lahaina as a safe harbor with its calm waters. Metaphorically it provides an anchor for the students to the school and the close knit community.
