Are you fluent in at least one other language than English? The Hawai'i State Board of Education recognizes that speaking more than just one language is a valuable skill, worthy of respect. The Seal of Biliteracy was established to recognize those graduating seniors who speak BOTH of the state's official languages OR one of the two languages as well as another language. The Seal of Biliteracy is awarded upon graduation. In order to receive the Seal of Biliteracy applicants must:

- 1. Be a graduating senior enrolled in a Hawai'i public or charter school;
- 2. Demonstrate a minimum overall 3.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) upon graduation;
- Successfully complete courses required for English Language Arts or Hawaiian Language
 Arts for a high school graduation diploma with a minimum 3.0 GPA upon graduation; and
- 4. a. Attain a score of "5" or above for one or more of the world language assessments (the list is available on the application)
- b. Attain a rating of intermediate-mid level on the HIDOE-approved 'Olelo Hawai'i assessment, OR the American Sign Language Proficiency Interview (ASLPI) OR other HIDOE-approved ASI assessment
