Aloha Students, As we continue through the school year, we want to ensure that our campus remains safe and organized for everyone. Please take a moment to review the following parking policies, which are effective immediately:

Parking Assignments & Protocol

No Double Parking: Double parking is strictly prohibited in the student parking lot at all times. **Unauthorized Vehicles in Your Spot:** If you arrive at school and find another vehicle parked in your assigned spot, do not park behind them or in another assigned space. Instead: Park your vehicle in the dirt lot. Immediately report the issue to the administration office. Provide your assigned spot number, as well as the make and color of the vehicle currently in your spot.

Restricted Areas

Students are only permitted to park in their designated spot in the student lot or the dirt lot. You are not allowed to park in other areas of the campus, including the athletic lot, the gym, or the library parking areas.

Consequences & Detentions

Any student found double-parked, parked in the wrong spot, or parked in a restricted area will be issued 2 hours of detention.

Special Note for Seniors

Please remember that you are held to "Senior Expectations." To attend milestone events like the Senior Luau and Commencement, you must keep a clean disciplinary record. You will not be allowed to attend these events if you have outstanding detention hours. Please ensure all detentions are worked off in a timely manner to avoid missing out on these celebrations.
